#### Accepting Jesus' forgiveness

Trauma survivor, Devon, struggled with deep guilt over what had been done to him and over his own sinful choices. He believed in God but also talked about what he needed to do to get to heaven. **On Easter, it clicked.** Jesus lived the perfect life for Devon and died to pay the penalty for every sin. Jesus loved Devon and forgave him completely. Devon chose to trust that forgiveness by praying **"I believe Lord,** 



help my unbelief".

Types of Trauma Survivors Served in 2023 include:

- Widows
- Domestic abuse survivors
- Adult survivors of childhood abuse
- Survivors of sex trafficking
- Hero families (first responders and military)



Types of Trauma Support include:

- Scheduled Peer Support Calls
- Emergency Peer Support Calls
- Program graduation celebrations
- Resourcing (providing referrals to counselors, programs, books etc.)
- One-time consultations

Riley was struggling with the temptation of infidelity when things at home felt impossible. Shalam Ministries helped Riley realize that painful feelings about their spouse and children were **coming from past trauma**. Shalam Peer Support was there for Riley when childhood trauma came to the surface. A family unit was saved when, in a pivotal moment, **Riley chose to stay** with their spouse and children and continue to work to heal from the pain rather than try to escape it.

## HERO'S REST PROGRESS IN 2023

Big milestones were reached at Hero's Rest in 2023! We **reached our goal of moving** Shalam Ministries' base of operations and our full-time staff members onto the Hero's Rest property. In the first half of the year, despite our contractor being in a bad car accident, we were able to **finish the staff house** and most of the workshop. Then, in August, many volunteers helped us load the moving truck in Illinois. When we got to Missouri even more volunteers showed up to help us unload on the hottest day of the year (104°F). All together, **over 53 people helped** with the move (p. 6)!





In September, a local coffee shop - The American Cup, with the help of many local businesses, hosted a fundraiser for Hero's Rest! The "Helping the Hero's" event was the **most successful** community led fundraiser in Shalam's history! It also helped connect us with local first responders and potential volunteers.

The year finished up with **multiple volunteers** coming out to help set up the staff house and help with property development. (p. 7)


